

**Please stand** whilst the minister invites us all to share the **peace** with these or other appropriate words...

*All are invited to share a sign of peace by turning to the people near you and **shaking each other's hands**. We are gathered as the family of God and desire to live in peace with our brothers and sisters in Christ.*

**We sing our Offertory Hymn** during which bread and wine are brought forward and an offering of money is taken from the people and presented to God.

## **Please sit** for the **Eucharistic Prayer**

The Lord be with you

**Listen, and we will hear.**

You give us happy times and things to celebrate.

In these we taste your kingdom, a feast for all your children.

You made us all, each wonderfully different,

to join with the angels and sing your praise...

We thank you, loving Father,  
because, when we turned away, you sent Jesus, your Son.  
He gave his life for us on the cross and shows us the way to live.

*The priest prays for the Holy Spirit to come down from heaven and fill the bread and wine with Christ's presence.*

Send your Holy Spirit that these gifts of bread and wine may be for us Christ's body and his blood.

*Child: Why do we share this bread and wine?*

**Listen, and we will hear.**

On the night before he died, when darkness had fallen,  
Jesus took bread.

He gave thanks, broke it, and shared it with his disciples, saying...  
'This is my body, given for you. Do this to remember me.'



*You may like to bow your head here or make the sign of the cross as a mark of respect to Jesus.*

After they had eaten, he took the cup of wine,  
gave thanks, and shared it with his disciples, saying:  
'This is my blood, poured out for you and for many,  
for the forgiveness of sins.'

*Again, you may like to bow your head here or make the sign of the cross as a mark of respect to Jesus.*

we celebrate his love, his death, his risen life.  
As you feed us with these gifts, send your Holy Spirit,  
and change us more and more to be like Jesus our Saviour.

*Child: How do we follow Jesus Christ?*

**Listen, and we will hear.**

***Please remain seated...***

Help us, Father, to love one another,  
as we look forward to that day when suffering is ended,  
and all creation is gathered in your loving arms.  
And now with all your saints we give you glory,  
through Jesus Christ, in the strength of the Spirit,  
today and for ever.

*In Jerusalem there is a church on the spot where Jesus is said to have taught his friends the 'Our Father'. Around the walls of that church the prayer is written in many different languages. We say that prayer now...*

*As children of God, let us **pray** as our Saviour taught us...*

**Our Father in heaven,  
hallowed be your name,  
your kingdom come,  
your will be done,  
on earth as in heaven.  
Give us today our daily bread.  
Forgive us our sins  
as we forgive those who sin against us.

*The priest **breaks** the **communion** bread...*

*We pray together the Agnus Dei...*

*Agnus Dei means Lamb of God and is a title for Jesus.*

**Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world,  
have mercy on us.**

Here we are asking God to  
make us worthy to receive  
communion.

Draw near with faith.

Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you,

Eat and drink in remembrance that he died for you,  
and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

## **We share in communion**

*All are welcome at the Lord's table. If you usually receive the bread and wine in any Christian church, you are welcome to receive here (even if you have not done so for a long time). If you prefer to receive a blessing, please come forward to the altar rail and simply keep your hands by your sides.*

After receiving communion, we have a time of quiet; you may find these prayers helpful as you sit and reflect...

Lord Jesus, you have blessed me today, and shown me your love,  
help me take your blessing and your love into the world.

Amen.

Eternal God, whose Son is the way, the truth and the life,  
grant us to walk in his way, to rejoice in his truth,  
and to share his risen life.

Amen.



## **Prayer after Communion**

After **communion** a short time of quiet is kept for personal prayer and reflection, then we pray together...

**Lord, we have broken your bread and received your life.  
By the power of the Holy Spirit keep us always in your love  
Through Jesus Christ our Lord.  
Amen.**



***We sit to hear the minister give the Notices***
